Michael used humor to connect with the students before talking about his personal story, peer pressure, drunk driving and how alcohol can impact a student's career, family and community. During the After Prom events, the agency provided a video entitled "The Truth about Marijuana" and played a marijuana facts game with the students. Both provided the students with information about the dangers of youth marijuana use and how it can negatively impact lives and communities.
