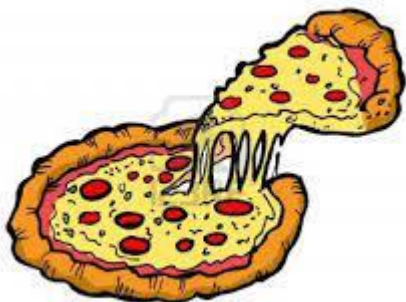
Mental Health Update
